LETTER FROM OUR PRESIDENT & CEO

As I reflect on the 2025–2026 fiscal year, one word comes to mind: **resilience**.

As our annual campaign unfolded, Pennsylvania faced both a prolonged state budget impasse and significant uncertainty surrounding federal funding priorities. We will continue building a future where every child has the opportunity to succeed, every family has the chance to achieve stability, and every older adult can age with dignity and connection.

BUILDING BRIGHTER FUTURES

Education is the foundation of a strong community. By supporting programs that promote learning, literacy, and student success, we are helping children develop the skills and confidence needed to reach their full potential.

INSPIRING FUTURE INNOVATORS

United Way of Lackawanna, Wayne, and Pike Counties continues to expand STEM learning opportunities through hands-on classroom experiences and regional events. In 2026, the **NEPA Girls STEM Competition** celebrated its 10th anniversary, welcoming a record-breaking 300 students for a day of engineering, technology, mathematics, and science challenges. Supported by a \$10,000 grant from Sanofi, the event helped students build confidence, strengthen problem-solving skills, and explore future opportunities in STEM fields while inspiring the next generation of innovators and leaders.

BUILDING A LOVE OF READING

Dolly Parton's Imagination Library of Lackawanna County continues to encourage early childhood literacy by providing free, age-appropriate books to more than 5,000 children, helping families build home libraries and shared reading routines. Since 2022, over 91,000 books have been delivered locally, supporting early language development, school readiness, and a lifelong love of reading. United Way also hosted its 2nd Annual Storybook Breakfast, engaging more than 200 children and families in interactive literacy experiences that bring stories to life.

BRIDGING GENERATIONS

The Pen Pal Program paired 110 fourth-grade students with 110 RSVP volunteers for monthly letter exchanges that strengthened writing skills, confidence, and communication. Beyond literacy growth, the program built meaningful intergenerational relationships that encouraged connection, belonging, and mutual support between students and older adults.

STARTING STRONG

Success By 6 supported kindergarten readiness through the Start Strong Together initiative, hosting community events that connected families with developmental screenings, early learning resources, and support services. By bringing together educators, healthcare providers, and community partners, the initiative helped families identify needs early and strengthen children's social, emotional, language, and literacy skills. These efforts empower parents and ensure more children enter school ready to learn and succeed.

READING & MATH SUCCESS

United Way's **Transforming Readers** and **Transforming Math programs** provided individualized academic support to more than 725 students across seven school campuses with the help of dedicated volunteers. Focused on early elementary learners, the programs strengthened foundational literacy and math skills while building student confidence and engagement. Students demonstrated significant academic growth, with many reaching or exceeding grade-level benchmarks and showing improved problem-solving, fluency, & comprehension.

A HEALTHIER TOMORROW

Good health is essential to a strong community. Through partnerships, programs, and community investments, United Way of Lackawanna, Wayne, and Pike helps individuals and families access the resources, support, and services they need to live healthier, more stable lives.

EMPOWERING DIGITAL ACCESS

Access to technology is essential for staying connected, informed, and independent. Through our digital connectivity efforts, more than 200 one-on-one **tech tutoring sessions** were provided to help older adults build confidence using devices, accessing online services, and staying connected with family and community. In addition, 40 free laptops were distributed to seniors, expanding digital access and reducing barriers to technology. Together, these efforts are helping older adults bridge the digital divide and engage more fully in today's connected world.

TRUSTED MEDICARE SUPPORT

PA MEDI provided free, unbiased Medicare counseling to 869 beneficiaries in 2025, helping older adults make informed healthcare decisions and save more than \$299,000 through Medicare Advantage plan and prescription drug plan reviews. The program also processed 134 subsidy applications and hosted 12 Medicare education classes throughout Lackawanna County, expanding awareness and understanding of available coverage options. Through trusted, one-on-one support, PA MEDI continues to ensure local seniors have the resources they need to access healthcare coverage.

EXPERIENCE IN ACTION

The **Retired and Senior Volunteer Program (RSVP)** engaged 152 active volunteers who contributed more than 7,510 hours of service across 38 unique opportunities at 29 partnering sites from July 1 to June 30. Through tutoring, companionship, and critical nonprofit support, these volunteers used their experience and skills to meet pressing community needs while strengthening social connections and reducing isolation.

Through this initiative, Wayne County is taking meaningful steps toward building a more connected, supportive, and age-inclusive community.

The **Dementia Friendly Dining** initiative launched this year, with three local restaurants officially becoming Dementia Friendly Restaurants. CREATING FINANCIAL STABILITY

When individuals and families have a strong financial foundation, they are better positioned to achieve their goals and overcome challenges. United Way works to connect people with the resources, support, and opportunities that promote long-term financial well-being.

MAKING EVERY DOLLAR COUNT

Through the **VITA program**, United Way helped more than 2,350 families across Lackawanna, Wayne, and Pike Counties access free tax preparation services, bringing \$2,221,429 in federal refunds back into the local economy, of which \$458,788.50 were Earned Income Tax Credit dollars. By ensuring eligible individuals and families received the refunds they earned, VITA helped reduce financial burdens, increase household stability, and put more money back into the pockets of hardworking community members.

SUPPORTING FOOD SECURITY

Through the **State Food Purchase Program**, United Way of Lackawanna, Wayne, and Pike Counties distributed \$455,933 to seven local agencies during FY 2025-26 to help address food insecurity across our region. These funds support the purchase and distribution of nutritious food for individuals and families in need, ensuring community partners have the resources necessary to meet growing demand and strengthen local food assistance efforts.

WARM HEARTS, WARM HOMES

Through the **Gift of Warmth program**, United Way provided nearly \$172,000 in assistance to help 251 households, representing 682 individuals, meet critical heating and utility needs. By helping families and individuals stay safe and warm during the winter months, the program eased financial burdens and ensured vulnerable community members had access to essential support when they needed it most.

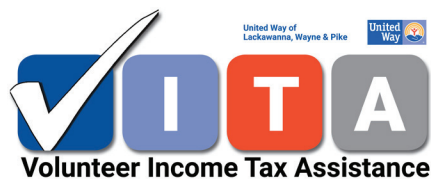
A SEASON OF GIVING

The **Toys for Tots** campaign helped make the holiday season brighter for local children and families through the generosity of our community. This year, the program distributed more than \$11,000 in financial support and over 6,000 toys, ensuring thousands of children received gifts and experienced the joy of the holidays. In addition, over **1,000 free Thanksgiving meals** were delivered to older adults across the region, facilitated through the Age-Friendly initiative and United Way. Thanks to the collective efforts of donors, volunteers, and community partners, the season was filled with holiday cheer.

RAPID RESPONSE SUPPORT

Through Pennsylvania's Rapid Response initiative, United Way supported **200 dislocated workers** in Lackawanna County by connecting them to timely information and local resources during periods of job loss. These services helped individuals access critical support, explore available options, and take next steps toward new employment with greater stability and confidence.

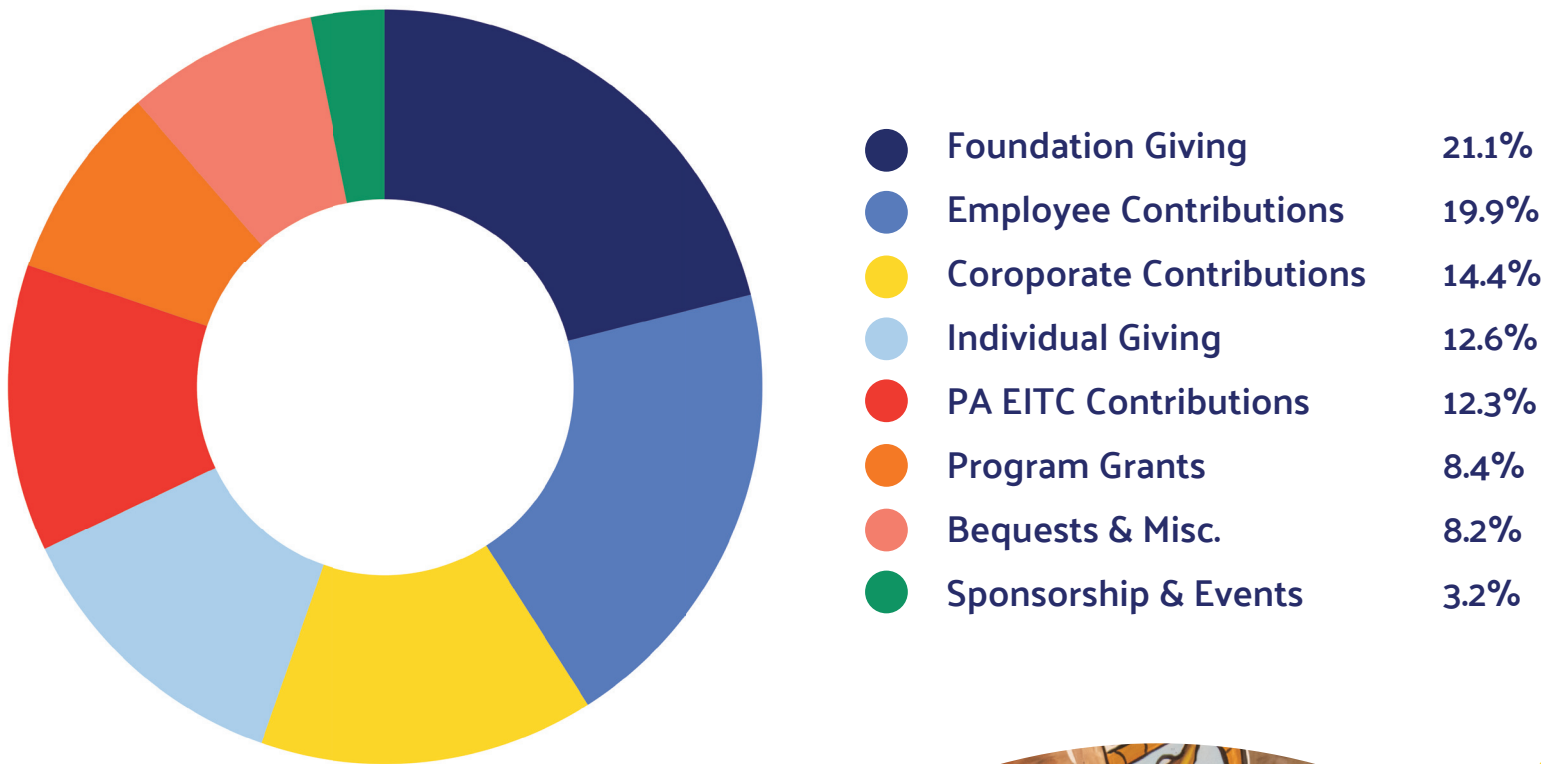

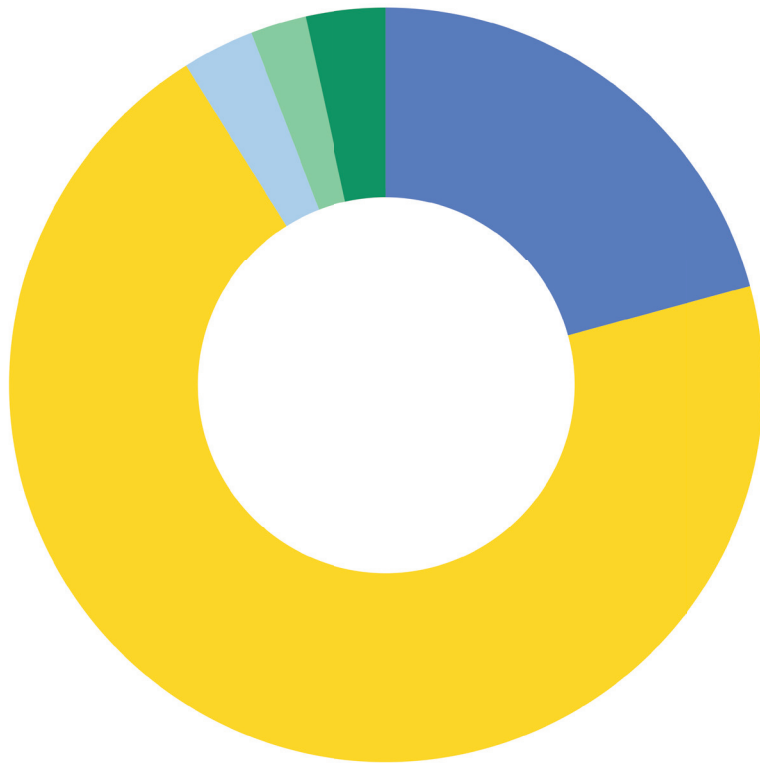
